Statement of services for which the decoration has been awarded.

On the 6th December, 1988, when Constable Bhupinder Singh, alongwith Constable Onkar Singh, was on patrolling duty in the area of Police Station Jahangirpuri, he noticed three bad characters named Madan Lal, Sardari Lal and Mohan Dass, indulging in selling of smack. Constable Bhupinder Singh told them that there were complaints against them for selling of smack, they should accompany them to the Police Station Jahangirpuri, and that they are to be produced before the Station House Officer. All the three accused resisted and a scuffle took place. Both the Constables tried to over-power them but in the meantime, Madan Lal whipped out a dagger and stabbed Constable Bhupinder Singh on the left side of the chest and ran away. Without caring for his injury, Constable Bhupinder Singh tried to chase them for about 20-25 yards but due to excessive bleeding, he collapsed on the ground. The assailants also tried to attack Constable Onkar Singh but he saved himself with the help of a lathi and raised an alarm. Constable Onkar Singh also chased them but they ran towards DDA Flats and escaped under the cover of darkness. Constable Bhupinder Singh was rushed to Hindu Rao Hospital, where he succumbed to his injuries.

In this incident Shri Bhupinder Singh, Constable displayed conspicuous gallantry, courage and devotion to duty of a high order.

This award is made for gallantry under rule 4(i) of the rules governing the award of Police Medal and consequently carries with it the special allowance admissible under 5, with effect from the 6th December, 1988.

Statement of services for which the decoration has been awarded.

On the evening of the 23rd June, 1988, Shri Gurjant Singh, Head Constable and Shri Chanchal Singh, Constable, were on patrol duty. When they reached in front of Kothi of Sangit Cinema owner in the jurisdiction of Police Station Division No. 6, Ludhiana, two Sikh youths fired upon them. Both the Police officers returned the fire with their stengun and revolver. As a result of cross firing, Head Constable Gurjant Singh received injuries and one of the two assailants fell down. The other one ran away from the scene towards Partap Chowk. Constable Chanchal Singh, who was also injured, chased the fleeing terrorist but could not go far. He fell down and succumbed to his injuries. Head Constable Gurjant Singh was removed to Christian Medical College and Brown Memorial Hospital, Ludhiana in a serious

condition due to bullet injuries. The dead terrorist was identified as Manjit Singh alias Jiti, resident of Police Station Payal, District Ludhiana. He was involved in five criminal cases. A .38 bore revolver alongwith three live and three empty cartridges was recovered from the deceased Manjit Singh.

In this encounter Shri Gurjant Singh, Head Constable and Shri Chanchal Singh, Constable, displayed conspicuous gallantry, courage and devotion to duty of a high order.

No. F.16(19)-PD/89.—Government of India hereby makes the following amendment in the Special Deposit Scheme for non-Government provident, superannuation and gratuity funds announced in the Ministry of Finance (Department of Economic Affairs Notification No. F. 16(1)-PD/75, dated 30th June 1975 as extended by its Notification No. F. 16(8)-PD/84 dated 12-6-1985. The amendment will come into force from 1st January, 1990.

For paragraph 6, as modified vide notification No. F. 16(12)-PD/86 dated 29-10-86, the following paragraph shall be substituted, namely :—

“6. Interest will be allowed on the summation of daily balances from the actual date of deposits at the rate notified by the Central Government from time to time. Interest will be paid on 1st January each year provided that in case of refunds of a deposit before the termination of the Scheme, stipulated in paragraph 9 below, or on termination of the Scheme, stipulated in paragraph 10 below, interest for any remaining period will be paid along with the amount of the deposit.

Provided, however, the rate of interest specified above is liable to be charged and may be altered by the Central Government at any time without previous notice, if, in the opinion of the Government of India, such a modification becomes necessary. Any alteration in the rate of interest will, however, be applicable prospectively as from the date or dates to be announced by the Central Government in this behalf.”

RESOLUTION

Subject :— Establishment of “National Open School Society”.

No. F. 6-2/89-Sch.3.—Government of India hereby resolve to establish “The National Open School Society” for proper development of Distance and Open Learning System at the school level.

2. Aims and Objects

The aim and objects for which the Society is established are the following :—

- (i) to provide sound professional advice to the Government of India and to the States, regarding the proper development of Distance and Open Learning System, at the School Level, in the country, in response to requests from the Governments concerned;

- (ii) to develop and prescribe or offer a wide spectrum of courses of study, for purposes of general and continuing education, either leading to certification at the school stage (middle, secondary or senior secondary) or without certification;
 - (iii) to develop and prescribe or offer vocational courses to the students of the Open Channel;
 - (iv) to develop study materials, using print, audio and video aids;
 - (v) to collaborate with agencies and institutions who would be willing to provide learning assistance to the students and to accredit such Learning Support Centres or Study Centres;
 - (vi) to establish Regional Centres, for purposes of supervising the proper functioning of the Learning Support or Study Centres;
 - (vii) to publish or cause to be published and to print the learning and other materials developed by the National Open School;
 - (viii) to prescribe rules and conditions governing the registration of students, eligibility to appear at the examinations, and all other matters consonant with, and necessary for, the proper fulfilment of teaching;
 - (ix) to prescribe and demand payment of such fees and other charges as may be authorised by the Rules, and as amended from time to time;
 - (x) to take over the administration and management of the Open School of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi, with all its assets and liabilities and to amalgamate it with the Society;
 - (xi) to frame Service Rules and bye-laws for the personnel, administration of the Staff of the Society and Rules and bye-laws for the proper management of the several functions and responsibilities vested in the Society, including welfare measures for the staff and to amend these from time to time;
 - (xii) to do all such lawful acts and things, whether incidental to the powers aforesaid or not, as may be required in order to further the Aims and Objects of the Society.
3. The Society shall be an autonomous body registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860.
4. The Society shall consist of the following :—
- (a) Chairman of the National School who shall be appointed by the Government of India, on such terms and conditions as the Government may decide.
 - (b) Vice Chairman of the National School, who will be the Director (Academic) and designated, ex-officio, as Vice-Chairman.
 - (c) Secretary of the National School, who will be ex-officio, the Secretary of the Society.
 - (d) Heads of the Departments of the National School, namely :
 - Director (Academic)
 - Secretary (Administration)
 - Controller of Examinations.
 - (e) Nominee of Department of Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development.
 - (f) Nominee of the Integrated Finance Division of the concerned Ministry/Department, Government of India.
 - (g) One representative of N.C.E.R.T.
 - (h) One representative of N.I.E.P.A.
 - (i) One representative of C.B.S.E.
 - (j) Three nominees, one each from the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, from Doordarshan and All India Radio.
 - (k) Nominee of the Department of Women and Child Development.

- (l) Nominee of the Ministry of Welfare.
- (m) A representative of the Indira Gandhi National Open University,
- (n) Director General or nominee of the National Literacy Mission Authority.
- (o) Nominee of the Vice-Chancellor, Delhi University.
- (p) Nominee of Secretary (Education), Delhi Administration.
- (q) Director/representative of the Open Schools/Correspondence Schools in the States.
- (r) Commissioner, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan or nominee.
- (s) Director, Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti or nominee.
- (t) Nominee of the Vice-Chancellor of SNDT, Bombay.
- (u) Two representatives from industries which are linked with the vocational courses provided by the National School.
- (v) All the members of the Executive Board, not included above.
- (w) Two specialists/eminent educationists, to be nominated by the Central Government.

5. The members of the Society shall be members of the General Body of the Society. The Society shall be supported by the funds placed at its disposal by the Government of India.

6. The General Body shall have vested with it the responsibility to assist the Society by providing sound and professional advice and counsel. Further, there shall be an Executive Board which will have the power to make and frame bye-laws which without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions may provide for the following :—

- (i) For the preparation and sanction of budget estimates, the sanctioning of expenditure, making and execution of contracts, the investment of the funds of the Society and the sale or alteration of such investment, and account and audit;
- (ii) Define the powers, function and conduct of business of the various Committees, as are constituted by it from time to time and the terms of office of their members;
- (iii) For creating various categories of posts, academic, administrative, technical, supervisory or ministerial, and for selecting and appointing persons to such posts;
- (iv) To frame Service Rules for the proper administration of the Society and of its personnel, including terms of tenure of appointments, emoluments, allowances, rules of discipline and other conditions of service of the employees of the Society as well as measures and norms for the welfare of the members of the Society;
- (v) For the establishment and management of funds, grants and allowances;
- (vi) To select a seal for the Society and provide for the safe custody and for proper use of the seal;
- (vii) To provide buildings, premises, furniture and apparatus and other necessary equipment and facilities for carrying out the work of the Society;
- (viii) For all other matters, as may be necessary for the furtherance of the objectives of the Society and for the proper administration of its affairs.


